TIME FOR A CHECK IN!

Welcome to the second edition of the Muskrat Minute, the sporadic newsletter of McCarrons Lakefront Alliance! Before we get into association business, we want to take a moment to say we hope you are all taking care of yourselves and staying healthy. We know it's a crazy, scary time and we wish all of our neighbors the very best. We also want to give a special thank you to the healthcare workers, first responders, essential workers and others who are on the front lines keeping people safe. And thanks to those of you who are staying home for the greater good. We are all in this together!!

AN EXCITING UPDATE ON E. COLI

None of us want to see an extended beach closure due to E. coli again. We learned in March that in addition to its regular sampling of the beach, Ramsey County has agreed to do E. coli testing in other areas of the lake if necessary. Here's how it will work: The county will do routine beach testing, as always. But if sample tests go over the limit for E. coli, the county will return the next day and re-sample the beach and four other locations around the lake at the same depth, and at the same time.

If there's a multi-week closure, the sampling will be done each week the beach is closed. All results will be posted on the county's beach website, and perhaps on McCarronslakefront.org. In the event of another beach closure, additional testing will help us know if other areas of the lake are safe for use.

The county will also use a company called Driven Wild to see if trained dog harassment will help drive the goose population from the public beach. The county is investing in 16 weeks of Driven Wild's services.

The Capitol Region Watershed District has also noted expanded areas of E. coli testing as a goal in its 2020 management plan for the lake, so we hope this is a commitment that will extend beyond this summer.

ASSOCIATION FUN

McCarrons Lakefront Alliance also hosted our first winter social this February with a fire and s'mores out on the lake. It was a great time and wonderful to catch up with neighbors old and new!
